Director of Library Services Denise English reports that in January 2002, the Florida Community College System and the Florida State Uni-

versity System selected Ex Libris (USA) to supply a new automated library management system that will replace the existing library automation systems (LINCC and LUIS) for the state's 28 community colleges and 11 universities. Selection of Ex Libris' ALEPH system was the culmination of nearly a year of evaluation by an LMS Selection Committee comprised jointly of representatives from the community colleges and state universities. Implementation of the new system is anticipated to begin in summer 2003.

The ALEPH Implementation Steering Committee, comprised of library administrators and librarians with public services/technical services expertise from the community colleges, state universities, and the State Library of Florida, has been created to address policylevel issues that will affect both systems, and to provide guidance during the implementation phase. Denise English serves on the steering committee.

As part of the implementation process, committees have been created to design a system that will serve Florida's college/university students, faculty and staff. Betsy Hoagg, South Lake librarian, has been chosen as one of four community college representatives to serve on the OPAC Functional Task Force, charged with designing the computer interface for the new system. Rhonda Smith, Reference/ Instruction Librarian, adds that the library's new CCLA service makes on line sources easier to use. Instead of typing a 14 digit ID every time, faculty and staff can set their office/home computers to automatic login. Here's how: (1) Go to www.linccweb.org/AutoLogin. asp (2) Enter your 14 digit library ID and your 4 digit pin (the same number you use to renew books, etc. Last four digits of your social security number) (3) Click create (4) On the next screen, click confirm (5) On the final screen, click exit. Automatic log-in can be set in campus computer labs and classrooms as long as they are not open to the general public. Because of licensing restrictions, the service is not available for student home computers. For questions, contact the LSCC libraries or the site's FAQ link.
