From the President ...

Fall semester marks the final phase of our 40th Anniversary Celebration. Therefore, it seems fitting that the College would cap this exciting year with record-

breaking enrollment, welcoming more than 3200 students this term. Our FTE enrollment is up nearly 28% over last fall! Our year to date enrollment is 18% ahead. These results are as amazing as they are challenging.

It has taken a great team effort...the recruiters in the schools, admissions and student services staff who are often the first LSCC contact with students, the maintenance workers and support staff who make our campuses so attractive and friendly, the information technology, library and media staff who help us stay connected and informed, the administrators who plan and guide our efforts. and the faculty who make learning come alive in the classroom. It took many long hours of hard work, but most importantly, it took a real commitment from each of you to our mission of serving students in order to achieve this record enrollment, and I thank you for it. Over these past few weeks, in addressing a number of area civic and business groups, I always tell them how proud I am of the job you are doing to provide a quality education to the people of our district. "You can travel farther and you can spend more money, but you can't get a better education than right here at home!"

As you recall, our Board approved an incentive payment if we were to exceed our budgeted enrollment goal. We have certainly accomplished that! In the next few days, we will prepare our enrollment report to the state. At that time, we will be able to determine the incentive amount to recommend to the Board. Because the incentive is in recognition of all of our efforts, each full-time and regular part-time employee hired by July 1, 2002 will be included. The payment will be made in October.

Speaking of money, please consider contributing to our LSCC Foundation "Raising Dollars for Scholars" campaign. Last year, it provided \$99,675 to 165 students. A major factor in our enrollment increase is the economic downturn. As people lose their jobs or have their hours reduced, they turn to us to open a door to a better future. However, these are also the times when state revenues decline, so community college students end up paying a larger share of the cost of their education. In 1996-97, tuition at the state's community colleges was 76.8% of the U.S. average, with Florida students paying about 24.3% of the cost. In 2001-02, tuition in Florida had increased to 84% of the U.S. average, and the burden on students rose to 30.3% of total cost. I think you can see that without the help of the Foundation many of our students could not afford to continue their education. Please give generously, if you can.




