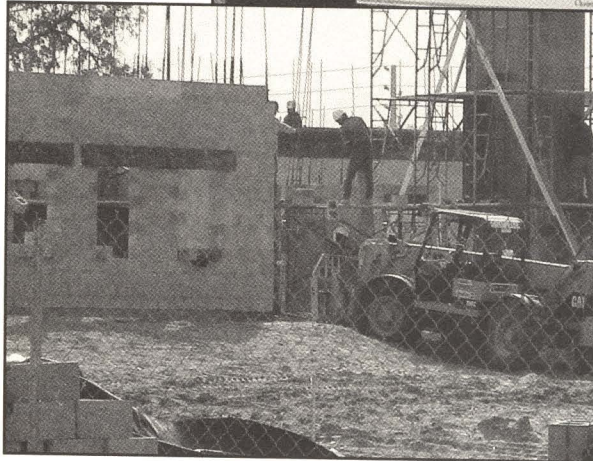
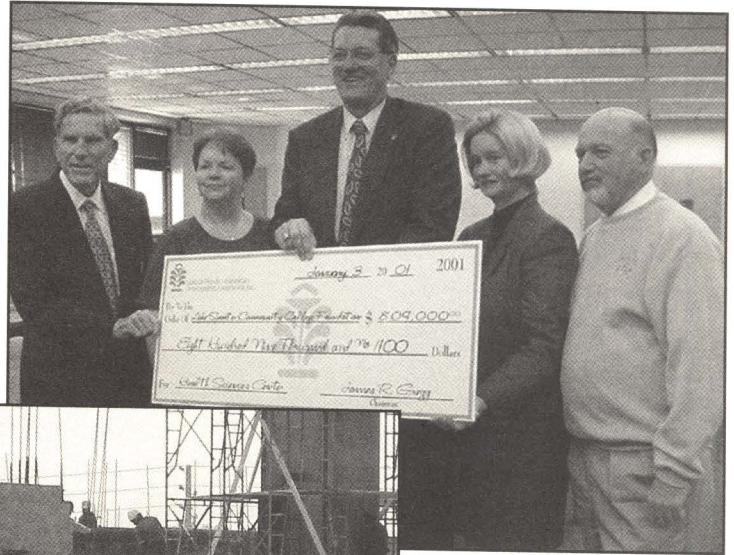
## Grant Furnishes Classrooms

The Central Florida Health Care Development Foundation awarded a grant for \$809,000 to Lake-Sumter Community College for our Health-Science Center.

The grant will be used to outfit "smart classrooms" with state-of-the-art technology, including two with distance learning capabilities, for use by LSCC's nursing program, dental assisting program, HIT program and other health-related programs. In addition, the college will receive a matching grant from the State Community College System Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program, bringing the value of the gift to more than \$1.6 million.

The CFHCD Foundation was created as a result of the partnership of Leesburg Regional Medical Center and Orlando Regional Healthcare. It helps fund projects that benefit and enrich the health and quality of life of people in our area.

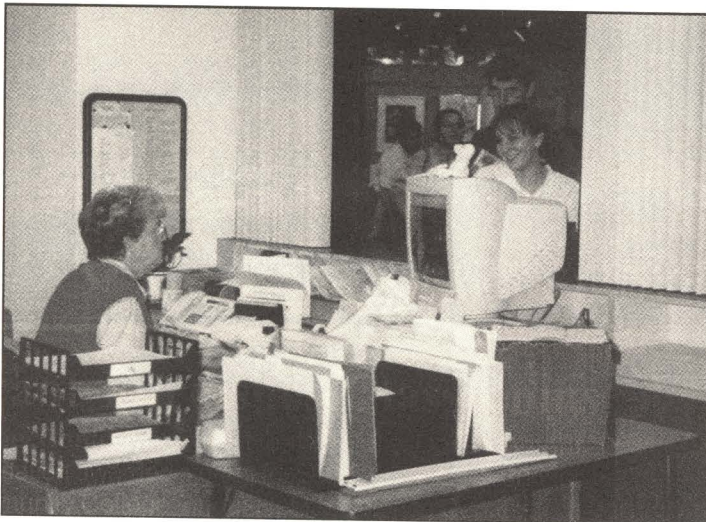
Bi-annually, the foundation welcomes grants from established health-care related organizations. In a short time, these projects have made a significant impact on the health of our community.

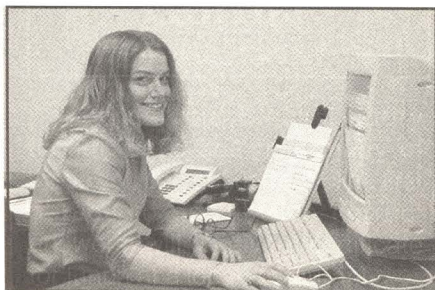




February is Black History month. Let's see how many of these you can get correct. The first person to get all five correct answers, will receive a certificate for lunch at a local restaurant.

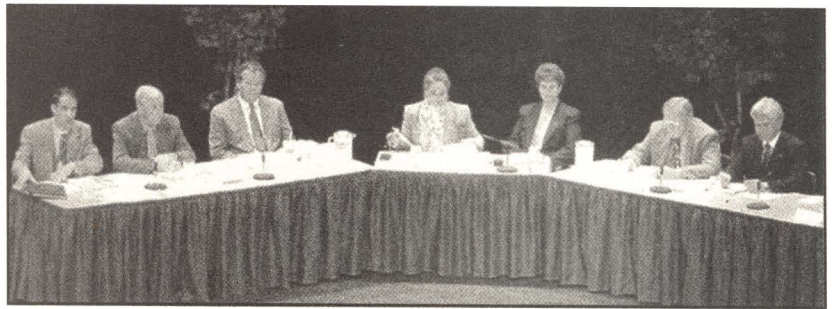
## LSCC Grad Returns as Intern

went on to attend the University of Central Florida.

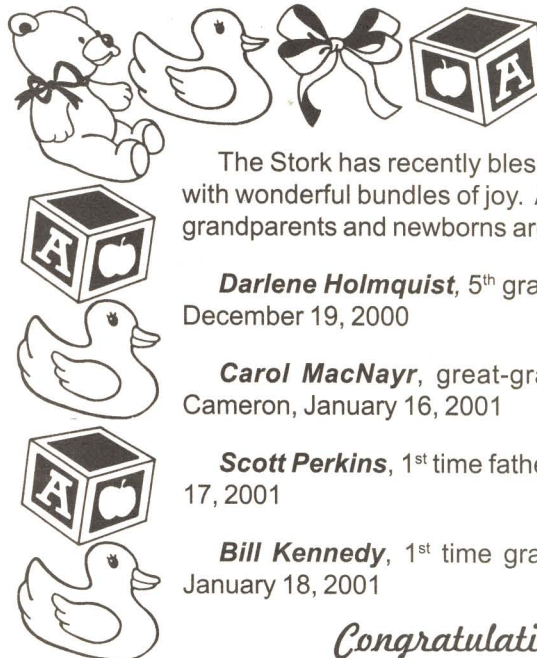
An advertising and public relations major, Jane will graduate in May with her BA. The Eustis High School graduate, intends to stay in the area following her graduation.

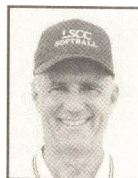
