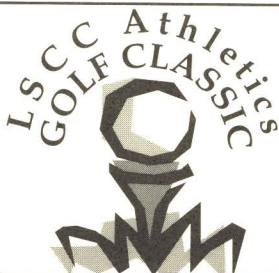

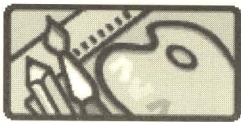

Gallery Art

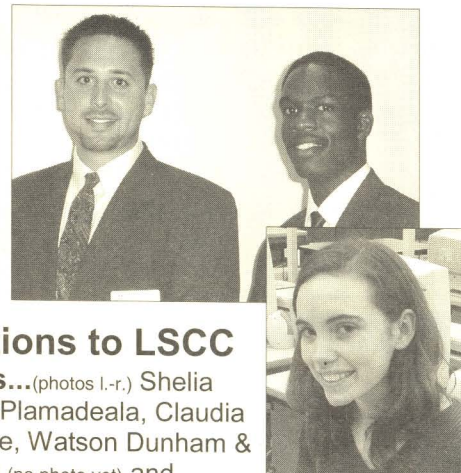

PRESIDENTIAL SEARCH UPDATE

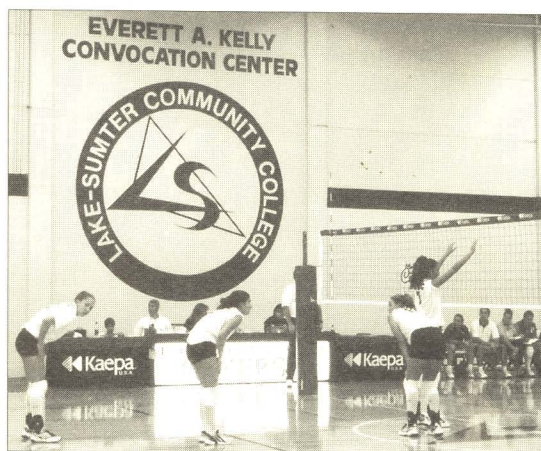
"The Presidential Search Advisory Committee (PSAC) has met twice and its process is running smoothly," says Joan Knost. Advertising began on September 14, in *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, and so far, 15 applicants have made themselves known to LSCC. The deadline for applying is October 26. The pool of applicants will be narrowed by December 3; those on the narrowed list will be asked to provide 30-minute videos of responses to questions provided by PSAC. A smaller group of candidates will be forwarded to the District Board of Trustees by February 15. Joan Knost is staff contact for the presidential search and can respond to any questions you may have. The applications are being filed in her office and are open to anyone who wishes to review them.

LSCC Volleyball received its first NJCAA National Ranking. The team is now considered to be one of the top 20 teams in the nation. "This is a great accomplishment for our athletic program and for our team. The girls have worked hard and this level of recognition will help to challenge us for the remainder of the season," stated Head

Coach Steve Bishop. The team was on a 13-match winning streak until it bumped into Pasco-Hernando C.C. (ranked 15th in the nation). While the games were close and neither team had a decisive lead as the match went to five games, PHCC pulled ahead in game five to win the Microtel Classic Volleyball Tournament, held on the LSCC Campus Sept. 21-22. The Lakers hope to even the score as both teams vie for a spot at the FCCAA State Volleyball Tournament on Nov. 1-3.

from those not able to attend.

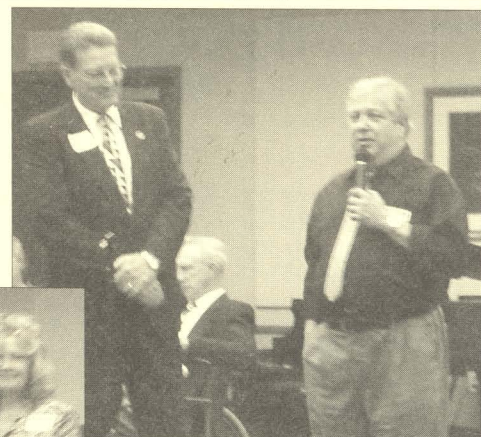
